Saint Francis of Assisi was born in Italy around 1181 into a life of abundance. In his youth he was renowned for drinking and partying until, after being captured in battle, he spent a year in prison. During that time, he began to receive visions from God asking him to repair God's Church and to do so by living a life of poverty. Soon after his release--inspired--he abandoned his life of luxury and began to preach and live the Way of Jesus Christ. As a result of his actions, he has had a profound effect on our world. His life and legacy still ministers to us today through millions of followers around the globe, including the current Pope.

Saint Francis lived a radical life and he prayed prayers most of would not dare for fear they would be answered. **He prayed to know the deep suffering of our God (which is difficult to understand) but he also prayed to know in that suffering the overflowing abundance of God's love.**

"My Lord Jesus Christ, two graces I beg of you before I die: the first is that in my lifetime I may feel, in my soul and in my body, as far as possible, that sorrow which you, sweet Jesus, endured in the hour of your bitter passion; the second is that I may feel in my heart, as far as possible, that abundance of love with which you, Son of God, were inflamed, so as willingly to endure so great a passion for us sinners. I beseech you, O Lord, that the fiery and sweet strength of your love may absorb my soul from all things that are under heaven, that I may die for love of your love as you deigned to die for love of my love."



CHURCH NEWS

Session Highlights - October 28, 2020

Carol Leimbach presented the stewardship campaign brochure titled "LIVING the FLOW BETWEEN."

Session approved a proclamation honoring Art Michalek for his faithful service as elder, usher, ten years of service as a Presbytery Commissioner, and over 34 years serving as the unofficial greeter for Sunday morning worship services.

- The continued "pause and consider" postures of the Renovation Task Force and the Capital Campaign Committee
- Reactions to the Session's Racial Issues Statement
- Congregational meeting process and voting modifications required by COVID-19 restrictions
- Progress in right-sizing the church rolls
- Continued positive church financial forecasts

Elder C. Gresham Bayne reported on the developing proposal to continue providing on-line worship and other services to a "Virtual Church" congregation that has been attending the streaming Sunday services. The Session encouraged Bayne, along with Elders John Brand and Chris Capen, to expand their working group and explore feasibility and process planning.




ELDER BIOS - Class of 2023





Just as we have all had to re:imagine how we work, serve and worship, our Ministry Partners around the globe have done the same. **Rev. Dr. Sasan Tavassoli** serves as a Presbyterian missionary with The Outreach Foundation. International travel restrictions have created previously unimaginable opportunities for him to reach Iranian youth around the globe. He has begun a live weekly satellite television show entitled "Christianity Today" in which he presents a new topic, book or theologian addressing a contemporary topic of interest. He reaches both religious and non-religious university-educated Iranian youth. This live format allows for deeper interaction via phone calls, email and social media which would not have been possible prior to the pandemic. He is also now able to teach a live weekly online class for Pars Theological Center, an Iranian Bible College. This also provides opportunity for lively discussions with students who are primarily Persian speaking church leaders from Afghanistan, Turkey, the UK, Norway, Germany, Sweden, Denmark, Canada and the US. For security reasons, students in Iran do not take online classes.

Dr. Tavassoli wrote," *As we all continue to find new ways of spreading the Gospel, please pray for the current situation for believers in Iran. The crackdown on Christians and other religious minorities in Iran is worsening and the situation for human rights is deteriorating.*

As always I want to express my deepest gratitude for every one of you for all the years you have loved, prayed for and supported us in our ministry. 
