A note from Pastor Karla...



It is a common story that in parts of Africa, Asia, and South America, when a hunter is wanting to catch a monkey, he or she creates a monkey trap.

The idea is quite simple--take a gourd or hollowed out coconut and create a hole big enough for a monkey's paw then tie it to a tree. Once it is securely tied, place a special treat inside the hole. When a monkey ventures by, he sticks his hand in to grab

the treat but then is unable to remove his hand while his fist remains clasped. Rather than drop the treat, the monkey becomes trapped. The monkey, by not recognizing the obvious problem, causes the loss of his freedom.

We can't blame a monkey for not understanding the rationality behind the monkey trap, but, sadly, monkey's aren't the only ones that fall for such nonsense. Often we humans cause the loss of our own freedom as well (although we don't often see it that way). Instead of unclasping our hands so God might release us from the power of sin, we clasp tighter to things that

May Is Endowment Month—Remember the Endowment



May is traditionally Endowment Month—a time to focus on the work of the Endowment at PLCPC. Like so many other things, we missed that celebration in 2020, but we are glad to return this year. After a brief description of the Endowment, we ask you to do three things.

The Endowment is a special way to contribute to the long-term support of PLCPC's work. Unlike annual or project gifts, a gift to the Endowment is meant to support the church in perpetuity. Endowment gifts are invested and only the income from the investment is spent. (The current principal of the Endowment is over \$2 million, but only the annual income is spent, the principal is preserved in investments.) We are thankful for the members and friends of the church who have contributed to the Endowment—especially in this pandemic year.

Session Highlights - April 28, 2021

At the start of the April Session meeting on Zoom attendees divided into smaller groups to discuss Pastor Karla Shaw's question, "If we read a newspaper article about our church five years in the future, what would be written about the development of our vision of 'Loving Everyone to LIFE with Everything we Have?'"

The Session's forward thinking was reinforced with plans to restructure Session committees during the June 5 Session retreat with the church staff. Session also reactivated the Renovation Task Force (RTF). RTF chair, Elder John Brand, will recruit new members and build plans for a campus renovation that will nurture PLCPC's emerging missions and programs.

And in a response to our mission of serving as an authentic community, Session approved the deletion of more than 80 inactive members in an ongoing membership review process.

are shadows of true freedom--wealth, ideologies, identities, relationships and so on--and then we blame God (and others) when we don't feel the peace, joy, and hope we long for. We would rather assume the problem is with someone else, than recognize the role we play in our own entrapment.

The letter to the Galatians, which we are studying this month in worship, is a document about the freedom we have been gifted through the work of the cross. But talking about freedom and actually unclasping our hands and heart so we can be set free are two completely different things. The first requires little of us. We can just sit back and agree. The latter means we have to trust that God is better than whatever we are so desperately clinging to. Do you trust God enough to let go?

"It is for freedom that Christ has set us free." Galatians 5:1.

Christ has done the work, now it's our turn.

On April 12, San Diego Unified welcomed children back into the classroom. Now that teachers, counselors and other legally mandated reporters have eyes on the kids we are expecting a huge spike in children entering foster care. San Diego saw a drastic decline in calls to its child abuse hotline while schools were closed. This decline was not because the abused stopped, but rather because no one was around to report it.

Now more than ever, we need caring capable adults to open their hearts to these children. You can help these kids by volunteering as a court appointed special advocate (CASA).

With a commitment of 10-15 hours a month, a CASA can change the life of a child by advocating for their critical services, including educational resources, living arrangements, and health assistance. Children also look to their CASA for emotional support, guidance, and companionship.

In San Diego, CASAs are matched with children in foster care through Voices for Children, a private nonprofit. No experience with foster care is necessary; Voices provides all of the training needed, plus a dedicated staff member to partner with you on your case.

Church member, AnneElise Goetz, is the current Chair of the Board of Directors for Voices. If you are interested in learning more about becoming a CASA please contact AnneElise directly at goetza@higgslaw.com.
