Today I took a plunge into the deep end of the swimming pool. I didn't think I would do it, I stood on the edge starring long and hard at the potentially cold water with little to no interest in getting wet. I was worried about my make-up running and having to do my hair again. I was worried I would be cold. But then I thought, "how many more years will my son want me to swim with him" so I put logic to the side and jumped...feet first. Yes, it was cold and yes, my makeup did run, but I also had a



lot of fun splashing and playing with an 8 year old boy and, most importantly, maybe for the first time in a long time, I *entered into my life* instead of just *being a spectator of it*.

Social media has taught us all how to be spectators of life. Watching the lives of others has become a national past time. And worse, those of us who document our lives for all to see, at times forget to actually live the life we are capturing by camera. This results in disillusionment and disappointment. A lot of us feel empty.

Paul though has a solution to that emptiness. Session Highlights - May 26, 2021

Session priorities continue to focus on the restructuring of our ministries, Session committees, and the ways in which they relate. The attendees spent some time with the Session Restructuring Working Group's worksheet which will help guide the staff/Session retreat on June 5. And the Session also endorsed Rev. Alex Wirth's proposal to extend the restructuring process to the Board of Deacons.

Pastor Karla briefed the attendees on the continuing reduction of in-person meeting restrictions on campus, and plans for full reopening in September.

The Session approved the deletion of 81 inactive members as proposed by the Membership Review Committee, and reviewed and affirmed the method with which personnel issues are processed.





Effective June 15, 2021, we are lifting the mask and social Return to full in-person worship is expected to occur on distancing requirement on the church campus for those who are fully vaccinated. In addition to masks being optional for the fully vaccinated, participants in all adult groups will no longer have to undergo check-in and checkout procedures. While this is a bright light at the end of a dark tunnel for many, please remember to remain sensitive to those in our community who are unable to receive the vaccine due to age or underlying health conditions.

Although the mask requirement is being lifted for the church campus, it remains in effect for the Preschool, as well as all staff, and volunteers (regardless of vaccination status) in certain situations. Masks are also still required to be worn by participants in our Children and Youth Ministry programs (including adult volunteers). If a youth participant, age 12 and up, is fully vaccinated, he or she must present proof of full vaccination prior to being permitted to be mask-free.

Supporting the Endowment Through Estate Planning

Remember the

Last month, in announcing that "May Is Endowment Month," the Endowment Committee noted that many

members and friends of PLCPC provide gifts to the Endowment in celebration of wonderful events (birthday or anniversary, for example), or in honor of family and friends. We also mentioned that many members of the church have given, or plan to make, bequests to the Endowment.

We welcomed questions. The most common questions will be answered through a series of Spire articles. The first question has to do with bequest-type gifts to the Endowment (discussed this month), and the second related to non-cash gifts will be address in the August issue.

The question about bequests is essentially what a person or family needs to do to make a bequest to the

Endowment. ("bequests" for this purpose means gifts completed after death, either through a trust or by will.) The Endowment has received many bequests over the years. Indeed, most of the principal of our Endowment is the result of such gifts.

In short, bequests to the Endowment are certainly most welcome and can be made fairly easily, but they do require planning, and clear, legally acceptable directions. This formality is required for bequests because trustees and executors must have unambiguous instructions, because the donor is no longer available to answer questions about intent. Making sure all the technical bequest requirements are met in a trust or will almost always requires professional assistance—for example, estate planning attorneys. The following is not legal or professional advice, but a few of the things that will likely

be required for an effective bequest to the Endowment include:

The Endowment of PLCPC must be clearly identified. That is, gifts received by the church generally do not go to the Endowment. Rather, only those identified "for the Endowment" will be permanently restricted for the Endowment funds.

The amount (which may be a percentage of a fund) or description of non-cash gifts (for example, property or stock) for the Endowment must be clearly described in the gift instruction. The technical legal requirements must be met for a specific form of trust or will. For example, the signing and witnessing of a will or trust are important.

Gifts to the Endowment always are placed in the principal of the Endowment, with the income available

(interest and dividends) in perpetuity for the work of the church. Details of the governance of the Endowment are included in the Endowment Bylaws, which are available from the church office.

If you are planning to make a significant deferred gift that will be received in the future, through a trust or will, for the Endowment, consider informing the church or Endowment, of your intention to make the gift. This will be on a confidential basis. It allows the church to plan for the gift, and allows you to specify that the gift will be for the Endowment

Backpack and Bus Pass Drive


