A note from Pastor Alex...

I have often wondered why we still produce this newsletter. We have so many faster, more efficient ways of communicating electronically that cost less and can reach more people than this relic of pulp, ink and staples. I thought that, if we worked at it, we could gather our whole community, the tech savvy and the technophobe, together online. Communication could be so much more clear if we just connected online.

Then the pandemic hit and we

could only gather together online. I better appreciated holding *The Spire* in my hand. I was grateful for a tangible, ink-on-the-page, record of our community because there wasn't much other physical evidence of our lockdown gatherings. There were no new coffee stains on the tables in the plaza. There were no bulletins stuffed into the hymnal rack. There were no echoes of a congregation speaking with one voice. There were no children finding all the best hiding places on campus. There were no purple stains from the leaky communion chalice with a hairline crack. *The Spire* was the only part of church that we could all touch in those days. Congregational Meeting Highlights—July 11

Rev. Karla Shaw called the meeting to order with prayer at 10:32 am in the Sanctuary, after a single 9:30 worship service. This meeting was attended in-person by more than 100 congregational members, and by members participating online using 55 logged-in devices via a Zoom connection coordinated by Online Ministry Director Melissa Mullins.

Karla then introduced Rev. Alex Wirth, who spoke of his affection for the congregation and staff at PLCPC, his appreciation of Karla, and of his desire to follow a call to shift his career focus to writing.

Karla mentioned that the congregation will have an opportunity to express their appreciation for Alex at a special event on his last day of service, September 5, and called for the vote to concur with Alex's request to move on, which passed.

Rev. Shaw reported on plans for the reorganization of church staff job descriptions and assignments, required as a result of Alex's resignation, other staff members' departures, and the online ministry development.

- Melissa Mullins has recently been hired as Director of Online Ministry.
- RO Smith, Youth Ministry Director, will join Mullins in the Online Ministry in a new role, Digital Content Producer, and will continue to serve as the Café Worship Leader.
- An Associate Pastor search will be on pause, and Parish Associate Rev. Dr. Chris Lenocker will become more active assisting in worship services and other ministerial functions. Other retired ministers in the community will be invited to

participate, as well.

- Director of Community Life Evan Gratz will expand his role to include Deacon leadership and training.
- Adult Ministries Director Elaine Burrell will add hours to her week and participate more directly in pastoral care and support groups, as well as organizing the retired pastors.
- Karla is now conducting searches for new Directors of the Youth Ministry, and, with the departure of Karen Connor, Children's Ministry.

Rev. Shaw went on to describe reorganization plans for worship services beginning on September 12. She said, "We will have four worship services: one Sanctuary service at 9:00 am., one pre-recorded online service at 9:30 am, a 10:30 am Café Service in the chapel, and Kids' Worship at both 9:00 and 10:30 am in our new Kids' Worship Space upstairs.

"I'm also really excited that *every* Sunday from 10-10:30 am our church family will gather with food and beverages in the Family Life Center so people across services and generations might mingle."

Rev. Shaw noted that the Renovation Task Force is still involved in developing plans to facilitate the emerging ministries and operations.

She then called for questions and discussion. Most members, both in person and online using the Zoom chat, spoke in support of the plans and appreciation of Rev. Shaw and the staff.

Rev. Lenocker closed the meeting with prayer at 10:58 a.m.

Supporting the Endowment With Non-Cash Gifts: Special Gifts for the Endowment with Great Tax Benefits too

Thank you for great the questions about special gifts to the Endowment. This month we respond to questions about some "non-cash gifts."

The simple answer is that the Endowment welcomes noncash gifts as a way of supporting the work of the church in the future. The more complex answer is good news and

bad news. The good news is that non-cash gifts have

substantial tax benefits that often exceed cash gifts. The (not so bad) bad news is that these gifts may require some planning to maximize the tax benefits, so it almost always is best to discuss such gifts with your tax advisor.

Non-cash gifts most commonly involve publicly-traded securities, which are generally converted to cash when received by the church. Other noncash gifts may also come from real estate, personal property (valuable artworks for example), insurance policies, or a wide variety of other sophisticated investment instruments. The Session has a formal Gift Acceptance Policy to ensure that gifts

of property are appropriate for the church to receive. We the Endowment are included in the Endowment Bylaws, are happy to provide information about these policies and which are available from the church office. to work toward receiving non-cash gifts that are

consistent with the goals and mission of the church. Please contact the church office with any questions about comments. Please feel free to contact the chair of the gift acceptance.

contributing to the Endowment: distributions from IRAs and Donor Advised Funds. Charitable contributions

distributed from IRAs are especially attractive under the

current tax laws, and usually can be easily arranged by the

retirement fund. Money held in Donor Advised Funds can

also be easily transferred to PLCPC for the Endowment.

cash gifts alike—donors must specify that they are for the Endowment. Gifts received by the church are transmitted to the Endowment only if they are specified to be for the Endowment. It is especially important to tell agencies that are transferring the funds to make sure that the gift is specified for the PLCPC Endowment. In addition, we recommend that you personally inform the church office, or the Endowment Committee, that your gift is intended to be for the Endowment.

Gifts to the Endowment always are placed in the principal of the Endowment, with the income available (interest and dividends) in perpetuity for the work of the church. Details of the governance of
