A note from Pastor Karla...

Do you remember the cartoon *The Jetsons* about a futuristic family who

drove flying cars and employed robots as maids? As a kid it was a magical world filled with all sorts of creative possibilities, but it was also not reality. Then on August 6, 1991, the World Wide Web became available for public use. We could not have imagined the impact that day was to have on our world.



Thirty years is not that long in the scope of human history, but based upon U.S. population statistics, the 30th anniversary of the internet means that 71% of our population was under age 24 when the internet became of use to the average person. That means that almost 3/4 of us have never known life without it. For most Americans knowledge of what's possible has been endless for the bulk of our adult lives.

That being said, it still took a global pandemic to help our church and many other churches see the real possibility of this limitless world. Social media platforms, podcasts and YouTube channels have certainly had a lot of negative impacts on our culture, but they have also allowed the Church to share Christ with those in difficult to reach places. I am not just talking about physical places located in the far-flung corners of this earth, but also metaphorical places--as we know that people search the internet when they are scared, lonely, and need help. People use the World Wide Web to find answers about the big questions presented by this life and ultimately to find

Session Meeting Highlights—August 25

Pastor Karla remarked at the August Session meeting how she is dizzy from the rapid passage of milestones and major changes in our church. The meeting began with Session's agreement to sponsor new member Jason Stevenor, an inquirer to the Presbyterian ministry. Session will partner with Jason for two years as he studies and serves.

The meeting ended with prayers and appreciation for the ministry and friendship of Associate Pastor Alex Wirth as he follows new calls in his life.

Much of the meeting focused on changes and improvements for our burgeoning online ministry. Melissa Mullins, Online Ministry Director, reported on the progress of installation of technical equipment and systems. The Session also advanced the preparation of a Bylaws amendment that will formalize the participation of

online members during congregational meetings. This amendment will be presented to the congregation for approval at the Oct. 3 meeting to elect elders and deacons.

The Session Restructuring Committee presented a proposal to reorganize the Session committees responding to our Mission Statement and Values, and the changing functions of the church. This topic will be discussed in the coming months.

The Session celebrated the good news of the hiring of Youth Ministry Director Michael Lombrano and Children's Ministry Director Lemuel Blackett. We are all dizzy!







Mission Beyond Updates

There are many ways for you and your family to get involved with a broad spectrum of local, regional and global partners, and we welcome your participation. Over the summer, the Vacation Bible School children contributed \$980 to Together For the Family (TTF) in Lebanon in order to purchase sewing machines for their sewing students. Since 2015, TTF has graduated more than 200 students following six months of basic training, including all the basic practical material need to start their own business or their own job.

Together For the Family is located in the Bekaa Valley of Lebanon on the border of Syria. Since 2010 they have ministered to the needs of Syrian refugees, especially women and children living in the refugee camps. Since the catastrophic port explosion in 2020 in Beirut, TFF has worked non-stop to bring food, supplies and hope to a people living through a dark time. The economy has collapsed and people face daily obstacles to securing food and medicine.
