A note from Pastor Karla...

"Give away your life; you'll find life given back, but not merely given back—given back with bonus and blessing. Giving, not getting, is the way. Generosity begets generosity." Luke 6:38 (The Message Bible)



South African Archbishop Desmond Tutu

is probably best known for his work as a human rights and anti-apartheid activist. In his book, *No Future without Forgiveness*, Tutu exhorts us all to live into the ancient African philosophy of Ubuntu--loosely translated as "I am because you are." This concept inextricably binds all of humanity together reminding us that our choices don't just affect us individually but have a greater impact on the whole-- despite one's best efforts, no one truly lives in isolation.

This includes our self-centered choices, as well as choices we make for others. And we shouldn't be surprised by *Ubuntu* as this is what Jesus preached to us in his Sermon on the Mount. When we give our lives away, when we let go and do good for someone else, we more often than not receive back double fold, as "generosity begets generosity."

I experienced this first hand in the Spring of 2020. Just as businesses were shutting down and industries were beginning to collapse during this pandemic, before I went to the Lord in prayer and was reminded of God's


