




hope and life. But, I have to confess, even with great mustering, the joy of this season has been dimmed a bit by the shadow of war happening in Ukraine.

Many of our Christian brothers and sisters of the past also understood how powerful our collective faith is, especially in difficult times. Declaring this faith has long been a practice of the confessional church of which we are a part in the PC(USA).

Session Meeting Highlights—April 27

Due to excellent financial PLCPC management and the generosity of its members, both current and past, the Session had the pleasant task of assigning substantial undesignated funds to developing projects at the April meeting.

The Session heard from Mission Beyond chair Elder Bob Lemke, about plans to convert a Sunday School classroom to a temporary shelter for refugees/asylum seekers awaiting court hearings. The project was approved for one year of operation. Mission Beyond will coordinate with the Safe Harbors Network, who will assign refugees to our shelter and assist in planning and operations. Several elders recalled a time in the 1970's when PLCPC hosted a Vietnamese refugee family.

During the meeting, the Session paused to pray for a CHP officer who had just been shot while on duty.

Elder Jason Stevenor, inquirer for ordered ministry and under care of the PLCPC Session, provided an update on his schooling and plans for the future. PLCPC has sponsored many aspiring ministers of word and sacrament during their preparation for service.

Session stated meeting date changes: No June meeting, then meetings on July 20 and August 31.

Session Restructuring Report

Last year a working group of Elders was appointed to research, discern and propose a restructure of Session. Our current structure is a 50's model and overtime has created some deficits in how we function as a leadership body.

In December a proposed design was conditionally approved by Session, which included the appointment of a Transition Working Group that would create the necessary processes, steps and training before actually moving into the new design. The biggest change will be moving from 19 committees to 6 teams of Elders built more intentionally around our vision and mission.

The Transition Team members are Gresham Bayne, Chris Capen, Claudia Grauf-Grounds, Bob Lemke, Cynthia Queen and Lynn Ziegenfuss. We will include a monthly report in the next several month's Spires, to keep everyone up-to-date.

We ask for prayers of wisdom as we desire that God would guide us in our task which will effect not only the Elders, but our staff, committee members, and our whole church community now and in the future.

In times of great crisis and uncertainty--the Reformation, World War II, the Civil Rights Movement--faithful people have come together to remind themselves and to proclaim to the world the centrality of Jesus Christ. These documents which have been created make up what we call our Book of Confessions. As Christians in the 21st century we meditate on these confessions as a reminder of who we are and, more importantly, whose we are.

This Eastertide we will be unpacking on Sunday mornings our newest adopted confession, the Confession of Belhar, which came out of the apartheid in South Africa. While the cultural context for this confession is different than our own, many of the themes of apartheid are present in the North American Church. This confession is a voice which calls us back to the purpose of the Church through the message of Jesus and intends to provide hope, even during an Eastertide when the news is difficult to watch.

I hope that you will join us either in-person or online for this significant series. Until then, may God continue to give us joy for the new life He is birthing in us.


Happy (Second) Retirement!

Only the income (interest and dividends) is available for spending. Thus, the principal (the original gift and appreciation of the investment) is retained to produce the income on an ongoing basis. (The bylaws currently provide that investments are in Presbyterian Foundation funds.) Put another way, the principal can never be



spent, rather it continues to produce income that will be available throughout the future of the church.
