A Note from Pastor Ed

My five-year old grandson Noah, while walking on the sidewalk, recently started saying, "Don't step on the cracks, or you'll break your mother's back." We've all said this ditty for generations. The cracks in the sidewalks are transitions from one slab of pavement to another. Even the lore of children

recognizes that transitions are hazardous places.

The "cracks"—the times of transition—in our individual lives bring out strong emotions:

- Putting the kindergartner on the school bus for the first time.
- Watching the graduate march down the aisle in cap and gown.
- The mother crying at a wedding.
- The once-healthy person suddenly becoming a patient.
- And then there is the greatest transition of all, the transition between death and our new life in glory.

Transitions are fearsome...emotion-laden...beautiful at times...always accompanied by anxiety. Such are the times of transition.

The singer and poet Leonard Cohen has written these words about times of transition:

"Ring the bells that still can ring, Forget your perfect offering. There is a crack in everything. That's how the light gets in." Anthem, 1993

These words have been posted on a bulletin board in my home for over a decade. They remind me that the cracks in our lives—the times of transition—are disturbing, but they're often the way the light gets in to our souls.

This is a time of transition in our life together as a congregation. It is a season of pastoral transition from one installed pastor, to an interim pastor, then to a future installed pastor. Transitions cannot be rushed. They cannot be hurried. They are part of the difficult pain of living.

In midlife, William Bridges threw himself into a demanding transition. He quit his job as an English professor Sunday Classic Worship Services 8:30 and 10:15 am in the Sanctuary 10:15 Café Service in the Family Life Center

and began an entirely new pursuit: the study of the nature of transitions, personal and organizational. His first book detailed his initial learning. *Transitions: Making Sense of Life's Changes* provided strategies for coping with the "difficult, painful, confusing times in life."

While Bridges wrote *Transitions* for individuals, it quickly developed an enormous following among leaders, who found Bridges' notions of the three stages of transitions a practical and useful way of understanding the complex dynamics of change. The first stage of transition is "endings" and requires saying goodbye to what has been. In our enthusiasm for what is to come, we often give this stage insufficient attention.

Bridges called the second stage of transition the "neutral zone", a time which often has the feel of 40 years in the wilderness. It is a time of confusion, uncertainty, and lack of direction. Even when the vision is clear, the direction unquestioned and the goal crisp, nonetheless it is a time of "feeling lost." But it is also the time of greatest gestation for innovation and creativity.

Bridges would tell us that we cannot make this stage go faster than it will. We must become comfortable living and leading in this unsettled space, and using the uncertainty as a way to help ourselves break out of our usual ways of thinking.

Bridges calls the final transition stage "making a new beginning." We must realize that while we may feel we have arrived in the promised land, we are only in the final stages of the transition. These three stages are what he calls a "natural process of disorientation and reorientation that marks the turning points of the path of growth."

As we move through this season of transition, let us remember that God often moves in mysterious ways through the cracks of our lives so His light can get in.
