As we enter the fourth quarter of the year the Session focused mostly on financial issues in the October meeting. While concerned that current payments on pledges are about \$50,000 under budget, Session reviewed the "With Everything" giving campaign for 2019 with enthusiasm and hope. Session elders received their own giving forms and will be prayerfully planning their commitments for 2019.


The 2019 budget is in process for preliminary approval in December and final approval in January, once commitments have been received. The expense budget will follow a plan of "2019 Funding Priorities" that the Session adopted. These priorities are adapted from our Vision, Mission and Values Statements.

The Session reviewed the next steps planned by the Renovation Task Force. On Nov. 10 and 11 the Task Force will guide members and friends of the church on tours of the education wing and other areas of renovation interest. Then everyone will be invited to share their own "Dreams for the Future." Session members will assist in these town hall meetings.

Additionally, \$50,000 was approved to hire design professionals to prepare church campus programming and master plan documents. This information will provide the foundation of our future decision-making.

## **News from Finance Committee**

At this time of year, many people more than 70 1/2 years old are in discussions with their financial advisor on how, when, and what to do with the Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from their qualified retirement plan. The 2018 tax changes provide for a number of changes regarding charitable deductions. One of these changes is likely to be of interest to anyone with an RMD for 2018 or 2019. You may avoid paying taxes on the RMD by using a "Qualified Charitable Distribution" (QCD) directly rolled over from your IRA. A QCD



amount rolled over directly to the church can cover amounts up to the RMD requirement, thus avoiding federal income tax. If the church can be of any assistance in setting up a contribution to PLCPC, contact Evelyn Lambino at (619) 233-1633 ext: 206.


