The Three Promises of the Endowment: Productive Investing

Happy 2020! May this be a year of good health, happiness, and joyful participation in our church. We also hope you will "Remember the Endowment" during the course of this year.

During 2019, the Endowment began a series of articles in the *Spire* to explain the promises an endowment makes to those who generously contribute to it. There are three Great Promises on which all true endowments are based. The first, which we looked earlier, is that donors' funds will be preserved in perpetuity. **The income will be spent but the principal will never be invaded, directly or indirectly**. This month we turn to the Endowment income—the funds that may be spent.

The Income of an endowment is critical, of course. It is what provides the funds to implement the desires of the donor, and benefit the church. This implicates the second of the three promises of the Endowment:

We will invest your money wisely. This investment keeps in mind the goal of perpetuity—what is known as an "infinite horizon."

Careful investing of the principal of the Endowment begins with the Endowment engaging in rational, prudent, careful investment practices that maximize return with reasonable risk. An Endowment has some advantages in terms of investment policy. The "infinite horizon" means that an Endowment should look not just at the next year or even five years, but at the long run net return of investing the principal. When done with care, this may allow an endowment to benefit from some reasonable risks that a shorter-term horizon would not permit.

There are actually two policies involved in the investment process. The first is, of course, an Investment Policy which outlines the principles by which the Endowment expects to maximize returns with reasonable risk. The second is, ironically, a "Spending Policy." That policy establishes the expectation about how much can be spent (from the income).

A Spending Policy is also usually used to protect an endowment from the ravages of inflation. A portion of the income may be set aside and added to the principal to help maintain the purchasing power of the funds.

The PLCPC Endowment has bylaws that essentially set out a broad investment policy and a form for spending policy. Under the terms of those bylaws, the principal of the Endowment are invested with the PCUSA (in the Presbyterian Foundation) in a diversified portfolio.
