A note from Pastor Karla...

What makes summer so special?

Growing up in an area of the country with four seasons, the answer is clearly "the change in weather." Despite scorching heat and suffocating humidity, summer was the best time of year for most people, because in one's most recent memory, the chill of the winter storm watch could still be felt. But in San Diego, since the fluctuation in

weather is not as dramatic, you would think summer wouldn't be so special, and yet it is! Summer is just as special here as anywhere. So, if not the weather, then what is the difference? What makes this time of year so much different than other times?

Most certainly, it is the relationships.

During the other seasons of the year, relationships are fostered and they grow, in most cases, more consistently. Many of us go to school or work, to sporting events or to regular bible studies. During these times we have structure and the people we interact with are fairly predictable. And this consistency is important. But most of these consistent meet-ups take a break in the summer months and what is left behind in these spaces that used to fill our calendars? Nothing. A void. Unstructured time--an unusual gift in our world today. And with unstructured time, we have more opportunity for Kairos moments--moments where we see God at work in places and in people we may not have noticed before.

My summer has been filled with all kinds of Kairos moments. Encounters at

Session Highlights - June 19, 2019 Session Meeting

The PLCPC Session and Board of Deacons held a shared meeting on June 19, 2019 in the Family Life Center. Rev. Karla Shaw provided probing questions on the status of the church, and then elders and deacons met one-on-one in "speed discussions." After about an hour the Deacons departed to continue their meeting in the Library.

The Session then welcomed the Renovation Task Force (RTF), chaired by John Brand, to present their report following 12 months of study. Brand thanked the other members of the RTF: Elder Douglas Buser, Susan Cramer, Will Hage, Bob Holst, Melissa Mullins and Director of Operations & Church Life Jolene Wade, for their participation.

Brand said that during their study the RTF determined that not only a renovation of certain areas of the church was required, but that a long range master plan would clarify the next steps and lead future renovation steps. He introduced Jon Dominy of Domus Studios, the firm the RTF has consulted in the development of the master plan.

Dominy presented a slideshow illustrating a three-phase plan. He noted that the current campus provides unusual challenges with its inward focus and meaningful features holding many cherished memories.

Following the presentation there was an enthusiastic period of questions and answers. The Session directed the RTF to present the plan to the congregation following the July 28 worship service. Then the Session directed the Finance Committee to prepare proposals for the formation of a capital campaign committee.

Prayer Quilt Ministry Celebrates 17 Years Sunday, August 18, 2019


More than 1,858 quilts tied with thousands of prayers
