Dear Friends,

Do you remember how fun it was to give and receive Valentines with your classmates? I am sure the tradition has morphed over time, and you each have your own traditions, but when I was a child, it didn't matter if the cards contained candy or a special treat, what mattered is that another kid in your class, someone that you

rubbed shoulders with every day, put a card in your homemade card holder. Because, in that moment, you felt special. Looking back on such a simple gesture, makes me realize how easy it is to bless someone's life. It doesn't take much to "see" someone, it just takes a moment of not looking at yourself.

Years ago, when I was in college ministry, I received a package on my doorstep. The package had been hand-delivered, no return address, so I immediately wondered what it could be. The Executive Committee meets occasionally to review policy issues and deal with emergent concerns on behalf of the Session

Session also approved the Service of the Lord's Supper dates and events for the year, and elected Em Cummins, Art Michalek, Gresham Bayne and Session Representative Barbett Wood as Presbytery Commissioners.

The 2019 Church Operating Budget was discussed and approved. While giving totals remain consistent, the number of pledging units has decreased making budget planning more difficult. Income of \$1,279, 250 is planned, and expenses are balanced to that amount. There will be no program increases. Session commended the staff and the Finance Committee for closing out 2018 with a \$25,000 surplus.

Session approved the replacement of the Family Life Center roof not to exceed \$50,000.

Rev. Shaw reported that Alicia McMillan has been chosen as Director of Worship and Music, and the Session joins the congregation in thanking the search committee: Karla Shaw, Mike Long, Rebecca Cress, Lynn Spafford, Sandy Brenner, Allen Hobbs and Linda Daugherty.

In San Diego County, nearly 9,000 of our neighbors are homeless (according to the Regional Task Force for the Homeless' 2018 Homelessness Summary Fact Sheet, though all experts agree that the actual number is far higher). Next month, March 9-22 PLCPC is hosting up to 12

homeless guests (men, women and children) who are actively working with case managers at Presbyterian Urban Ministries to seek employment, long-term housing and other services. Looking back on 2018, my first full year as your Senior Pastor, makes me smile at what God is doing in our church family and the ways that we continue to grow and be stretched. The last few months of 2018 were not easy for us, as we had quite a few of our church family pass on. From my position, sometimes it is difficult to see what kind of new life God will produce in us through all this death, but it is indeed there--as death is always followed by new life.

This past year brought with it the ministries of our new *Director of Community Life*, Evan Gratz, and our new *Associate Pastor of Congregational Care*, Alex Wirth. Pastor Chris Lenocker also became our official *Parish Associate*. Through these three fabulous men (who all started in February), we were introduced to a myriad of new ways to meet with God.

Also this year, Melissa Mullins began as our new Business Administrator. Under Melissa's leadership we completed a renovation of the church offices, streamlined our giving and HR practices, updated our technical systems, and adopted a new campus-wide Security Plan. Melissa also continues to work on our overall pathway to discipleship, including how we receive visitors. We also hired Joyce Pritchett, as our new Communications Coordinator who has helped us continue creating a consistent external message.

Our Session this past year adopted a new Vision, Mission, and Values. These important statements, which are expected to guide us for years to come, were rolled out to the congregation in September through a preaching series entitled "We Are PLCPC." The Session also formed a Renovation Task Force, chaired by John Brand, along with a Children's Education Task Force, tasked to determine facility needs for the back half of our campus.

In the winter and spring from the pulpit, we learned about the Kingdom of God from the parables and lessons from the wilderness. This past summer we did a sermon series on "Loving Our Neighbor." In that series, we had the opportunity to celebrate our mission partners and grow more in the area of SERVE. We now have SERVE opportunities every month. In addition, to sending a team to Rancho Genesis in July this past summer, in February we had a month of homelessness, and hosted, for the first time in many years, the Interfaith Shelter on our campus.

The theme for the 2018-19 school year is "With Everything." This is also the motto for our giving campaign, borrowed from our vision statement. We learned in late fall the importance of stewardship of our whole lives, and for the first time in our 80-year history, changed the approach of our giving campaign to include our talent and time.

For Advent this year, we experienced Christmas through our senses. Twice this year we had the opportunity to experience worship services under the direction of John Spafford, both of which were very meaningful—these included

the Tenebrae service on Maundy Thursday and the "Flicker of Hope" on Christmas Eve.

Looking back on 2018, it is hard to imagine that all this was accomplished, and so much more—as I didn't even mention the search for a permanent *Director of Worship*, structural changes to the Session and Deacons, the 30+ new members that committed to our community, the growth of the Café service, all the bible studies, the expansion of our Preschool, and all the general pastoral care that goes on during any given day as a community of faith.

As we continue in our vision of "Loving Everyone to LIFE with Everything we Have," I look forward to seeing what God will do in our midst in this coming year as we continue to abide in Him.

Associate Pastor Rev. Alex Wirth

It was exactly one year ago, on our last annual meeting Sunday, that I first preached for you all and you voted to receive me as your Associate Pastor for Congregational Care. 2018 has been a year of settling in, getting to know this community, and working toward living out PLCPC's Vision and Mission as your pastor.

I am glad that I've been able come along side the deacons and lead them in faithful conversations about how and why they do their work. We've added an equipping/ training piece to each of their meetings so that every time we gather is meaningful.

Business Administrator Melissa Mullins

2018 was a busy year for the maintenance and improvement of the PLCPC facility. The staff offices were slightly re-configured and renovated to meet the needs of our expanding team. The offices, Sanctuary, and Chapel were reroofed, we unified and strengthened the internet coverage throughout the campus and installed a new phone system. The sanctuary also had some needed repairs done to the ceiling and portico.

Thanks to the Deacons' Pancake Breakfast, a washer/ dryer and ice maker were installed in the FLC and seed money was collected for a new stained glass cross in the Chapel. The Renovation Task Force (RTF) was formed in July to evaluate the condition of the campus - primarily the preschool, children's education building and music areas. This committee is forming recommendations for how these areas of the facility can be updated to fulfill the mission of the church for years to come.

Under the leadership of Jerry Heidt a Security Task Force was also formed to research best practices and facility improvements for security on the PLCPC campus. The Security Plan was approved by Session in December 2018 and will be implemented in early 2019, which includes additional training for our staff, ushers, deacons and elders.

In conjunction with the Personnel committee, a new employee handbook was written and a volunteer handbook and procedures are close to complete.

A revised mission and vision for the church was a critical step in setting the direction of programming and funding. The staff has been in discussion for aligning all ministry activity to the values. We pray that we all grow in our ability to *Love Everyone to LIFE With Everything We Have*!

Interim Director of Worship Alicia McMillan

2018 has been a joyful and active year for PLCPC's music ministry. We welcomed all ages and offered musical opportunities ranging from traditional to contemporary music styles. Our choir ministry has been strong and active with four groups welcoming all generations; Cherub Choir for 4, 5 and 6 year-olds, Joyful Praise Choir for 2nd-6th graders, Brick Singers for grades 7-12, and the New Covenant Choir for adults. The Ringers ReJOYce! handbell choir, under Ann Simoneau's direction, contributed greatly to our services and seasonal events. The Cafe Band, under the leadership of R.O. Smith, has welcomed many volunteers and budding musicians of all ages. We have been blessed with faithful volunteers in the Worship Band and many volunteers in the Media Ministry headed by Dave Baker.

The 8:30 blended service lead by the New Covenant Choir featured traditional and contemporary music lead by piano and organ with the participation of Worship Band, children's choirs, bells and guest soloists and instrumentalists. The 9:45 Cafe service lead by the Cafe Band featured contemporary music with the participation of youth, children and adults as soloists and instrumentalists. The 10:45 traditional service featured traditional music with soloists, instrumentalists, organ, piano and bells.

The music ministry highlights for 2018 include our annual Christmas Concert with orchestra presented to more than 1,000 people in celebration of Christ's birth, the children's choir musicals in May and December, caroling to homebound by the youth choir, Easter services with brass and "Flicker of Hope" Christmas Eve services produced and choreographed by John Spafford. Bryan Verhoye was featured in two phenomenal concerts last fall attended by hundreds in our sanctuary. Bryan performed the Brahms 2nd Piano Concerto with the Grossmont Symphony and the Brahms Requiem with a double piano accompaniment with the San Diego Master Chorale. In August we were treated to another fun summer courtyard concert with Bryan and friends featuring jazz and contemporary styles. In January we hosted the San Diego Street Choir in all three services. In April, a Mennonite Christian Academy Choir and Band from Manitoba, Canada lead music in sanctuary worship services and in October we hosted Point Loma Singers from the Nazarene University.

Our Blackinton pipe organ has been a strong presence in leading congregational singing and inspiring joyful praise. The organ was a featured instrument in the American Guild of Organists sponsored organ master class lead by the San Diego Civic organist Raul Prieto Ramirez in October. Local organists and professionals attended the class.

The Music Ministry is grateful for the dedication of countless volunteers and participants who work tirelessly by sharing their gifts and talents. We look forward to a year filled with new opportunities and growth and listening for God's guidance in this new season of transition.

Director of Senior Adult Ministry Elaine Burrell

2018 was a year of change for Senior Adult Ministry. With the goal of offering more diverse programs of interest to the younger cohort of seniors. as well as preserving the muchloved programs for our eldest seniors, new programs were introduced. Weekly luncheons continued through June, with delightful themes, excellent musical entertainment and nutritious meals. Monthly lectures also took place on health topics, how to use public transportation, and creative workshops. Two major health/caregiving fairs were held in 2018, in partnership with SHARP. Exercise class continued weekly throughout the year thanks to our partnership with the Peninsula Family YMCA.

In June I attended the POAMN Conference in Lake Tahoe where many new ideas were garnered which bolstered and affirmed the need to make some changes to our programming.

In Fall 2018 new programs were introduced. Luncheons with entertainment were reduced to 1x/month and new programs were offered on the other Tuesdays: Current Event Discussion Group, workshops on healthy eating, lectures on health and well-being, even a laughter workshop! In November, an outing to the Welk Resort Theater was a favorite. Freeing up some of the Tuesdays also allowed for more outings, which I hope to continue monthly. Reaction to these changes has been generally positive.

I continue to stay current with trends in senior needs, through serving on the Board of the Peninsula Shepherd Center, attending trainings at the Glenner Center, earning my Certificate in Healthy Aging through SDSU, and staying informed about San Diego's County's Age Well Action Plan. In January, I will be attending a workshop on the Village Movement; and in February we begin our pilot partnership with OASIS Lifelong Adventure.

I am grateful for the opportunity to serve our cherished seniors through my role here at the church and look forward to new adventures in the coming year. FAMILY MINISTRIES

FAMILY CAMP:

Over the weekend of October 12-14, 101 people from PLCPC participated in our Family Camp at Camp Marston in Julian. It was a great weekend of connecting, relaxing, fun and learning for those of all ages.

We plan on gathering for a Family Camp Reunion in Feb.. ROOTED:

We launched our ROOTED small group series on Monday night, October 8. There were 21 participants that night. This is not only going to be a great spiritual growth opportunity for our church moving forward, but this 10-week course is designed to build connections with others and have honest and open conversations about our journey with God, while building strong relationships. The next round of ROOTED begins Feb. 25.

Director of Community Life Evan Gratz <u>MENS MINISTRY:</u>

More than 25 men attended and participated in our Men's Retreat at Rancho Viva in May of 2018. We had a great weekend of fellowship, worship and were challenged by a series called "The Battle," which focused on man-specific struggles and encouragements.

There were three Prayers and Pints events in 2018 that were each attended by 20-30 men respectively. These gatherings serve our men well in a casual, community setting that offers great opportunities for conversation and connections. We look to increase these to bi-monthly in 2019.

Our Men@Work Ministry happens with faithful men of PLCPC on Wednesday mornings. Those men have taken on so many projects both big and small around our church this past year, many of which go unnoticed. Thank you to Don Griffith, Em Cummins and many others for your faithful leadership.

The Men's Wednesday night group led by Dr. Gresham Bayne and Art Michalek has been growing and consistent all year. This is a group of guys committed to sharing in their lives and faith every week. All men are welcome to come and participate as often as possible. New for 2019 is a Monday Morning Men's coffee. This is happening every Monday Morning at Peet's coffee on Catalina Blvd. The goal for 2019 will be to continue pouring into the men of PLCPC and giving more opportunities for spiritual growth. While, at the same time building off of our current ministries and continuing to make them overlap and cohesive with God's vision now and moving forward.

OUTREACH EVENTS:

On May 31 we blocked off Udall St. in front of the church and along with support from the Point Loma Library, threw a neighborhood block party. With 3 food trucks, live bands, crafts and games for the kids and a 28-person video game truck, more than 300 people from our church and neighborhood enjoyed a local night out in the street!

Our Fall Kick-Off Carnival on Sept 9 saw carnival games, a magician and more than 250 meals served at our free BBQ. All while promoting close to 20 different ministries that PLCPC has to offer during this 2018-19 ministry season.

Director of Youth Ministry/Café Worship Leader R.O. Smith CAFÉ WORSHIP

The Café Service continues to experience exciting growth in both weekly numbers and energy, but also within the volunteer participation to help run the Café Service. There has been more communal ownership of the service which is reflected in the number of volunteers serving in various capacities within Café: worship band (15), Audio/ Visual (4), and hospitality & ushering (6). We are always open to finding ways to increase volunteer involvement and ownership, and experimenting with news ways to experience Jesus together.

The introduction of Kids Café, has cleared some space in the Chapel to accommodate potential growth within Cafe. At the same time, we do feel a real sense of loss without the energy and joyful "noises" of the younger kids in the Chapel.

<u>YOUTH</u>

One of the big changes we experienced this year in BRICK Youth was expanding BRICK Junior High from $7^{th} \& 8^{th}$ grade, to include 6^{th} grade as well. So Junior High Youth Group now consists of $6^{th}-8^{th}$ grade! It has been an adjustment, and overall it has been a great addition to the group. Here are some of the highlights from the last year, and projected highlights we look forward to:

CAMP EXPERIENCES

The camp experience is one of the crucial events in the growth and spiritual development of adolescents. This past summer, we took 22 high school students and 3 leaders to Lake Shasta for Houseboats. We also took 4 junior high students and 2 leaders to Catalina Island for Campus By The Sea Summer Camp. With the addition of 6th graders to BRICK Youth, I think the Campus By The Sea experience will grow significantly in the Summer of 2019!

CONFIRMATION

Confirmation is the time when young people claim the promises that were made on their behalf in baptism. The goal of the process is to help students understand what it means to be a follower of Jesus, and to walk alongside them as they make their own decision as to what they believe about Jesus. In the end, they will be active members of His church, and specifically at Point Loma Community Presbyterian Church. Last I am excited to be a part of the PLCPC community, and am year, we "confirmed" 6 students on June 10, 2018, and celebrated their confirmation with a luncheon for friends, family, mentors, and staff. Moving forward in 2019, Confirmation will be offered every other year to 7th-10th grade the church, and transform the world around us. students.

SERVICE OPPORTUNITIES & MISSIONS

We are hoping to grow more in our partnerships with Urban Life Farms and Ladle Fellowship. We have opportunities to serve at Ladle on the first Sunday of every odd month, and at Urban Life Farms on the second Saturday of each even month. Both opportunities are open to the entire PLCPC community.

This year, we have added a Youth Build Mission Trip in which we are taking a team of 6th-12th grade students during Spring Break to help build the new Rancho Genesis property in Mexico.

WEEKLY MEETINGS

This year, we changed our meeting night for Youth from Thursday to Monday. This was intentionally done in order to meet on the same night as BRICK Journey (formally Route 56), and hopefully create a more natural transition for kids as they "move up" from Children's Ministry to Youth Ministry.

WEEKLY SMALL GROUPS

With the addition of the 6th graders to BRICK Youth , we have seen an increase in our attendance for Junior High Small Group on Sunday mornings during the Café Service time. We generally have anywhere from 8-12 students. We have two faithful volunteers for that time, and are looking to add two more volunteers to be part of the Sunday morning small group community.

High School Small Group changed nights from Sunday to Thursday. We still meet at our house from 7-8:30pm. We have seen a slight increase in average attendance with the change of nights.

BOY SCOUTS

On September 23, 2018, Troop 24 had their Centennial Celebration. It was held at The Bay View Restaurant on the Marine Corps Recruiting Depot. It was an rich and encouraging time to be a part of. We are so proud to charter Troop 24.

CONTINUED NEED FOR ADULTS

Every generation of children have had the desperate need of adults in their lives in order to survive, and this generation needs adults more than ever. Recent research coming out of

Fuller Theological Seminary has revealed that the more adults "without an agenda" there are in the lives of students, the more likely those students hold onto their faith through college and beyond. Whether it is in the Children Department or Youth Department, my hope is that as adults, we will make a "life on life" investment for our children and students.

Director of Children's Ministry Karen Connor

2018 ushered in some important changes for our Children's Ministry program. After much discussion with senior leadership and other ministry leaders it was decided that 6th graders are best served by being part of the Jr. High group within Youth Ministry led by R.O. Smith. Children's Ministry now serves children through 5th grade. To go hand-in-hand with this change we reformed one of our mid-week programs to include 4th graders. Journey (formally known as Rt. 56) now meets every Monday night during the school year from 4-5:30 and serves 4th & 5th graders. To give the 6th graders some transition time we offered them a choice between Journey or Brick Jr. High starting in September of 2018. As of Feb 1, 2019, they will be asked to formally join the Jr. High group. To further enhance and align all children and youth programs all youth groups are meeting on Monday nights, making the Red Brick Church the place to be for children and youth grades 4-12. On Sundays, 6th graders are still welcome to attend traditional Sunday School during the 8:30 am hour, if they choose, since there is no program offered for Jr. High aged kids at this time. During the 9:45 hour kids, grades 6-8, are invited to take part in a small group held in the Youth Center. So far this change has been enthusiastically embraced by children and their parents. Our weekly Sunday School program continues to serve an average of 40-50 children each week. Dedicated volunteer teachers share their faith walk with the children through Bible stories, games, crafts, songs, and prayer. We welcomed up to 40 children a week each Thursday during Kids Club. The children participate in Bible stories, crafts, and games. This very popular program is held in classroom 8, and is typically paired with the Children's Choir, led by Alicia McMillian, but can be enjoyed separately.

In January, twenty six of our 4th-6th graders attended Forest Home Children's Winter Camp near Big Bear where they spent an engaging weekend with other Christian youth. Twelve children graduated from the **Bible Memory** course on May 13. These students in grades 3 (& above) participated in a special Sunday School class held during the school year to learn all about the Bible. They memorized scripture and learned how the Bible pertains to their daily lives. Upon completing the coursework they were awarded with a personalized Bible after reciting their Life Verse in front of the congregation.

Our MOPS (Mothers of Preschoolers) program, run by

Sarah Butterfield, hosts bi-monthly meetings from September through May. In the MOPS program moms with young children form relationships with other moms to share, learn, and grow in Christ together. Other MOPS opportunities include park dates, mom's night out, and a Book Club. The success and growth of MOPS prompted their move into the FLC as well as a change to Mondays. This helps to avoid conflicts with other ministry programs as well as accommodate more moms and strollers.

Vacation Bible School (VBS) was held the week of June 25. Our theme was "Shipwrecked." The sanctuary was transformed into an amazing island where a record 238 children gathered together to discover the wondrous things God does for them in their lives while also having a great time. Our mission project was to provide money for Rancho Genesis Ministries to help buy supplies for orphans in need. Together the children raised almost \$1,000. As always, a special thanks to the many staff and volunteers who gave of their time before, during and after the week of VBS. The program is not possible without them.

On Palm Sunday, we hosted our sixth annual **Easter Fest** as an outreach for our church and the community. Our expanded celebration encouraged attendance from all generations. Activities included live music, food, typewriter prayers, a youth scavenger hunt, a petting zoo, crafts, a bounce house, and a Hungry Hippo inflatable game.

In December, our staff came together to host our fifth annual **Red Brick Christmas** party in the Family Life Center. All ages gathered for the festivities which included gingerbread houses, crafts, a special visit from Santa and Christmas "Carol-oke." A new addition to our party this year was a "Wacky Tacky Fashion Show" in which attendees could show off their favorite Christmas wear on a lighted runway. Looking forward in 2019

On January 13, 2019, Children's Ministry launched a new Sunday worship service just for kids at the 9:45 hour. This new ministry is held in the Family Life Center. Children, ages 3 years-5th grade, meet as a group for songs, activities and a message before breaking out into small groups. Scripture, prayer and an offering are included in this dynamic experience where children hear God's story in fresh, fun, and meaningful ways. We look forward to this program evolving over the coming year to be a place that excites and engages children and encourages their attendance on Sundays.

Preschool & TLC Director Nicole Hage

The preschool continues to grow and thrive. This school year we added an extended day program to better accommodate working families. We provide programming from 8:00 am -5:00 pm. We have a total of 8 preschool classrooms. This gives us the opportunity to serve around 150+ families. We have one full time director, a part-time administrative assistant, 8 part-time lead teachers, 2 full-time teaching assistants and 9-part time teaching assistants all working together.

Every year we offer free early intervention and vision screenings. These are put on by Autism Tree Project

foundation and The Elks Programs. Our annual Poinsettia fundraiser was successful this year; We raised \$1,000 which was used to purchase tablets for the classrooms. We continue to invite preschool families to join church events and this is helping us grow our church. EasterFest, Red Brick Christmas and the neighborhood Block Party were all wonderful and brought many preschool families to our church. The preschool VBS and summer camp grew, and the families seem to enjoy having these safe and fun events for their children. At Christmas time the families gave Gifts to the Manger, which resulted in a car full of diapers and other baby supplies going to Military Outreach Ministries.

As we gear up for the next fall registration, we are excited to be expanding our extended day program to allow more working families into our school. Thank you for your continued support of the preschool!

Corporation Report Steve Smith

The corporate officers and committees work to ensure that the church complies with state and federal law, The Book of Order of the PCUSA, and good governance practices. During 2018, the church has continued to build on the revised Bylaws (2017) to create policies, operating procedures, and structures that allow it to operate efficiently and conform with legal requirements. As an example of this work, under California law (because the total gross receipts of the church now exceed \$2 million) the church is now subject to enhanced accounting and reporting requirements. The Audit Committee (chaired by Dwight Kellogg) has worked with the outside auditors and officers to ensure compliance. An archives committee (chaired by Kathy Wright) has been organizing the governance and historical records of the church. Special thanks of the congregation go to John Leimbach, who for more than twenty years has served as our treasurer and volunteers many hours a week overseeing the finances of the church. John Spafford now serves as our clerk (and corporate secretary) and helps maintain corporate records. For many years Tyler Cramer kept the church out of legal trouble by providing outstanding pro bono legal services from time-to-time, a role that Darryl Solberg has graciously taken on. I am most grateful to both of them for their assistance to me, and to the church.

I have been honored to serve as chair of the corporation the last two years. Dr. Gresham Bayne has served as vice-chair, and will be the chair of the corporation beginning 2019. He is an outstanding physician and entrepreneur, and longstanding member of the congregation. He will undoubtedly be successful in completing many of the projects the current chair did not finish.

Board of Deacons Jan Sutton

The Deacons provide a ministry of compassion and service. We have representatives on many Session Committees, support the OB Community Dinners, Loaves and Fishes, and Presbyterian Urban Ministries (PUM). We supply the baby roses, send greeting cards, college care packages and military care packages. We run the Lenten Food Drive which was another huge success in 2018. The Deacons collect backpacks and money for bus passes for PUM. Our Love Baskets give a meal to those in need.

Each Sunday, Deacons greet and welcome people to worship, and, after the service, deliver flowers to members of our community. On Easter, all Deacons helped to deliver more than 60 bouquets.

We supported many church events such as Ash Wednesday supper, Maundy Thursday dinner, Red Brick Christmas, and we served a barbeque to more than 200 people for FallFest. We held a reception to celebrate Pastor Alex Wirth's installation, and we had a reception for the visiting youth choir from Winnipeg, Canada. The Prayer Chain is run by a member of the College of Deacons and we help run the Discover Our Community classes.

The Deacons spent several meetings in 2018 exploring the book <u>Canoeing the Mountains</u>. We reviewed our passions and where we connect, and identified areas we'd like to improve our capabilities. To that end, we are having trainings for visiting in February 2019. These training are open to all members, and we are including the Deacons of Westminster Presbyterian Church.

Three Pancake Breakfasts raised money for: costumes for the children's Christmas Pageant, the Intergenerational Mission Trip, and the starter funds for a stained-glass cross for the Chapel. The Deacons also gave money for: Family Camp, the PUM Golf-4-Good event, Gaga Ball court for youth, the Wall of Honor in the Family Life Center, and a washer and dryer for the kitchen.

The Deacons are always working to make our church a caring church.

Nominating Committee Mary Harker

The Nominating Committee presented a slate of 5 new Elders, plus 2 returning, and 11 new Deacons, plus 3 returning, for election in September. The Committee also evaluated candidates for the Presbytery and presented a slate of 4 members.

The Mission Beyond Committee (MBC) is pleased to report the highlights of our work over the past year. As a church, we seek to "Transform Our World" by serving others in the name of Jesus Christ and to help carry out Jesus' commandment in Mark 16:15: "Go ye into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature." exercise classes, and health-care days. Approximately 2 attended the Ash Wednesday dinner in the Family Life (The annual Women's retreat averages 100-120 women attending a weekend retreat. The Women's Ministries bible study for young Mom's; a weekly Tuesday mornin study and the annual Women Connecting Dinner in the

One significant highlight in 2018 was PLCPC's participation in the Interfaith Shelter Network, a PLCPC Success that involved: (1) an average of 10 guests housed each night for

two weeks, (2) 141 guest-nights provided, (3) 296 dinners
served, (4) 136 lunches provided, (5) 144 breakfasts provided,
(6) 183 volunteer shifts worked, (7) 125 unduplicated volunteers
involved, and (8) 712 volunteer hours worked.

Approximately 7% of funds raised at PLCPC last year were devoted to mission-related service. MBC administers these funds by developing relationships with mission partners (both local & global) and distributing financial support. Perhaps more important than the finance-related portion of the committee's role, we provide and/or promote opportunities for PLCPC members to 'roll up their sleeves' and actively serve our community in the name of our Lord. MBC provided the umbrella support for SERVE projects including trips to Genesis, Ladle Fellowship service of food and work events such as at Urban Life. Additional highlights of 2018 include:

- Distributed \$69,000 in support to 19 mission partners (approximately 55% local, 45% global)
- Continued a pilot project with Uplift to assist families transitioning from homelessness to housing
- Commenced sponsoring a new village, Caña, in the Dominican Republic (Los Arroyones successfully graduated in 2017), as part of the global effort to end rural poverty by Plant With Purpose (PWP).
- Continued support for Urban Youth Collaborative (UYC). As part of their ministry on school campuses across San Diego, UYC works with youth from two PLCPC families to re-start and continue a Christian club at Correia Middle School.

Many committee members are seasoned volunteers with mission trips and involvement with local and global mission partners (including PUM, Uplift, Genesis, Military Outreach Ministries, OB Community Dinners, Plant with Purpose, Presbyterian missionaries and others) and would love to introduce you to 'plug in' to volunteer opportunities. We look forward to serving with you, our Congregation, and working to Transform Our World in the year ahead.

Adult Ministry

In 2018, much was accomplished in Adult Ministries. Both Men's and Women's Ministries facilitated many small Bible study and covenant groups, retreats, contemplative days, breakfasts, luncheons, and dinners with inspirational speakers.

Congregation and community seniors were provided exciting weekly luncheon programs, monthly excursions, exercise classes, and health-care days. Approximately 175 attended the Ash Wednesday dinner in the Family Life Center. The annual Women's retreat averages 100-120 women attending a weekend retreat. The Women's Ministries offers a bible study for young Mom's; a weekly Tuesday morning bible study and the annual Women Connecting Dinner in the spring. Two groups meet on Thursdays for bible study. Additional groups and opportunities offered during the week include: Sunday morning study; Men at Work; Community Bible Study; Mothers of Preschoolers- MOPS; Prayer Quilt Ministries; Red Brick Knitters and Rachel's Circle

The Men's Ministries also offered a weekend retreat with approximately 30 men in attendance. The men also met a few times during the year for fellowship, prayer and a light meal at "Prayers and Pints."

Adult Ministries offered a Block Party in the early summer, Fall Fest in September, Deeper Dive series and Rooted Small Group series. Family Ministries enjoyed Family Camp in October with many young families in attendance.

Women's Ministry

Our Women's ministries continue to offer a variety of opportunities for women of all ages and stages. We support several hundred from the PLCPC community and beyond.

CBS (Gail Bennett)

Point Loma Community Bible Study is in the middle of our 14th year, and we are grateful to PLCPC for hosting us each week. We meet on Thursdays from 9:30 - 11:30 a.m. We have about 140 women and 35 children participating. We are studying "Return to Jerusalem" this year.

Prayer Quilt Ministry (Lana Brenes)

In August, the Prayer Quilt Ministry together with the PLCPC community celebrated 16 years of wrapping people in God's love with prayer quilts. During the 16 years, more than 1,779 quilts were tied with thousands of prayers expressed.

Tuesday AM Bible Study (Clara Blenis)

In addition to a weekly Bible study, currently led by Pastor Karla, the group continues to be involved in various ministries including the collection of used stamps, UPLIFT, PUM, the Interfaith Shelter at our church, outreach to young mothers, Loaves and Fishes among others.

Wednesday AM bible study (Julia Roller)

The Wednesday morning moms' Bible study wrapped up the year with a Christmas brunch and will get back to meeting in January and finish up John's letters.

Women's Retreat (Kristin Stephany)

The retreat was once again be held at the Pala Mesa Resort, January 25 -27. The theme for the retreat was "Living Authentically."

Red Brick Knitters & Crocheters (Judy White)

We range in age from teens and college students who joined us during the summer months all the way up to great grandparents whose ages we would never ask! Skill levels are just as varied. Our basic project is knitting and crocheting 8" squares in any color, any pattern, plain or fancy, which are put together into blankets and given to our ministry partners. So far, we have completed and distributed 562 blankets.

Rachel Circle (Judy White)

The purpose of Rachel Circle is to foster friendships among women through monthly meetings, service projects, field trips &

interesting programs.
